## Blueprint for Our Future

For over 150 years, FMZBC has been a beacon to those seeking a relationship with God. As we continually strive to be "worthy of the Gospel of Christ," it is vital that we examine and prepare the Church for the future God has in store. Accordingly, Pastor Torian appointed a 16-member Strategic Planning Committee (SPC) to develop a five-year strategic plan. Throughout its year-long process, the SPC included members of, and worked in consultation with, leadership and the congregation. The FMZBC Strategic Plan 2018-2022 (SP 2022) was approved at the December 2017 Church meeting.

The Strategic Plan serves to strengthen our ability to achieve FMZBC's stated vision of "Sharing the Light: From the Promise, to Pentecost, to Points Around the World" and mission "To connect people who have a desire to become fully devoted followers of Jesus Christ." The SP 2022

- defines our direction (where we want to go)
- mandates that key ministries develop an Operations Plan (how we will get there)
- ullet establishes guidelines for making decisions and allocating resources

The core of SP 2022 is to continue our campaign of *Ministry Beyond the Walls* while simultaneously reinforcing our internal operations. SP 2022 documents six strategic goals and highlights six focus areas. Several initiatives in these focus areas are already in progress, including our Mortgage Elimination Campaign, outreach support to the Bethesda Church in the Dominican Republic, and our pending audio-visual upgrade in the sanctuary.

In the fall, the SPC will continue its support to key ministries in the development of operations plans. The Operations Plan will identify specific tasks and activities ministries will complete to help achieve the goals of the SP 2022. All members are encouraged to contact their Zone leaders and/or Ministry leads to learn more about the process and offer assistance.

We operate under the motto. "We Don't Remember Dates: We Remember Moments." There is an excitement about looking through photos and videos or reading through old Ministry minutes and recalling the names and roles of members past and present. We get asked: When did I become a deaconess/deacon?; Is my (relative) buried at First Mount Zion?; Do you have records for the \_\_\_\_ Ministry?; or Can you provide a summary of the history of the Church?

While no member of the Archives Ministry professes to be an archivist, historian, or even a librarian, we do our best to assess, organize, preserve, maintain control over and provide access to records and archived items determined to have long-term value to First Mount Zion. Quarterly (or so), we randomly select photos around a selected theme and display them in museum-like fashion on a large display wall. We host an Open House after Church services on fifth Sundays to make members aware of the existence of the Archives Room. Alternatively, the Room is available by appointment if members/visitors contact the Church's Administrative Office. New items to the archives are screened for their historical relevance to the legacy of First Mount Zion. If you have never visited the Archives Room, do plan to do so!

## Men's Ministry "Iron Sharpens Iron"

It was conceived in 1997 and has since become a flourishing Ministry. Every third month, the Deacons' Ministry at First Mount Zion Baptist Church supports the Community Outreach Dinner for the homeless provided by Streetlight Community Outreach Ministry. Since 2004, Streetlight has been working to feed the hungry and house the homeless in Prince William County and surrounding counties, with a staff of trained counselors and professionals. Its other programs aimed to alleviate suffering include a Supportive Housing Program, Food Pantry and Clothing Closet, and Homeless Campsite Outreach.

All ministries and congregation members are welcome to join us when we support this vital ministry. We serve dinner to all who come through their doors, and one of FMZ's associate ministers also accompanies us to share God's word in a short sermon of encouragement, hope and promise. In God, we all have an intrinsic value; and at FMZ, we demonstrate our commitment to helping each individual to rise above their present challenges to achieve independence and personal success by making ourselves available to serve others in need. You can make a difference!

## Trustees' Corner...

We'd like to use this article to share some educational insight into the Trustee Ministry's areas of responsibility. The Trustees hold title to, and are responsible for, the physical property and the financial matters of the Church, but did you know that the requisites and qualifications of Deacons equally apply to Trustees (1 Timothy 3:8-11 & 1 Corinthians 4:2)? Additionally, each FMZBC Trustee must obtain Bonding Certification via the Judge of the Circuit Court, Prince William County, VA.

Our Mission is to ensure that the development, acquisition, maintenance and use of Church property, as well as the overall fiscal management of the Church is done in a manner that is above reproach and in such a way as to duly carry out the Church's mission. FMZBC's Constitution and By-Laws identifies some 25 official duties/responsibilities for the Trustee Ministry, as shared herein.

The Ministry accomplishes its work through a spirit of service to God through <u>sound fiduciary practices</u> that are above reproach and conducted on behalf of the First Mount Zion Baptist Church Congregation and in coordination with the Pastor, Church Staff and Ministries.

#### FINANCIAL

Receive and account for all monies belonging to the Church.

Keep separate accounts of all funds raised or contributed for particular purposes.

Receive, preserve, and pay out all money, keeping at all times an itemized account for all receipts and disbursements.

Pay bills promptly when a valid invoice accompanies said bill.

Disburse funds only for the purpose for which they were raised or contributed.

Disburse emergency funds in accordance with the Emergency Disbursement Policy.

Review and resolve issues related to unauthorized bills.

Disburse benevolence funds, as authorized by the Deacon Ministry.

Make written financial reports and recommendations to the Church body at Church business meetings and at such other times as may be directed by the Church body.

Upon receipt of the Treasurer's report, the books shall be submitted for an annual audit at the February meeting of the church.

Hold in trust all property belonging to the Church.

Recommend the bank wherein the funds of the Church shall be deposited.

Approve all bills authorized by the Church for buildings, grounds, and other property before payments are made.

Refer all financial matters not covered by the budget to a Church meeting for the expression of its will.

#### **LEGAL**

Perform such other legal duties as are imposed by the Church and State.

#### **FAITH**

Manifest full cooperation with the Church leadership and support Church-approved programs.

Be faithful in attendance of all Church services.

Be faithful in attending prayer service, Bible class, Sunday School, and Leadership training.

Be faithful in the giving of tithes and offerings.

Be steadfast in the work of personal evangelism.

#### PROPERTY and FACILITIES

Take necessary measures to protect, manage, and maintain the Church's property.

Provide advice on liability and appropriate use of church property, whenever non-FMZBC members request use of the Church building.

When Authorized by the Church, buy, mortgage, lease, and transfer Church property.

Provide advice on liability and appropriate use of church property, whenever non-FMZBC members request use of the Church building.

#### **HUMAN RESOURCES**

Secure the services of a custodian by contract after approval by the Church.

Secure the services of Church employees after approval by the Church.

## Mission Accomplished!

This summer, God commissioned 20 missionaries to participate in the building of His Kingdom! On July 14-20, The CORE (FMZ's Young Adult Ministry) traveled to Villa Hermosa, Dominican Republic to take part in God's work. During this week-long assignment, 15 young adults and five spiritual guides worked to complete three



projects: the distribution of water filters to 25 Haitian immigrant households previously without clean water; mixing and pouring a concrete floor for the Bethesda Church; and cutting metal for the installation of windows for the Church as well. Additionally, the missionaries attended Sunday Worship, led Praise & Worship on Tuesday night, and taught Bible Study. In reflecting on this lifechanging journey, the common theme for all who shared in this experience was "GRATI-TUDE for the opportunity to spread the love of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ!" Even though there was a language barrier, the missionaries were pleasantly surprised at how God's love was reflected back at them

through the smiles, warm embraces, laughter, and prayers shared by the people of Villa Hermosa. The CORE is eternally grateful for the opportunity to step outside of their comfort zones to serve and honor God in ways that they never imagined.

Revival 2018 consisted of six days of inspiring wisdom and encouraging exhortation from three powerful guest preachers who kicked off our Revival. The consistent theme throughout was one of encouragement to us to trust in God's provision and stand firm on His promises; respect all and care more; be ready, willing and humble servants committed to an authentic covenant with God, who are seeking to fulfill the desires of God so that our presence brings greater life to people and circumstances around us.

Rev. Etoria Goggins opened the floodgates at our Sunday 8:00 a.m. Service with "Who Cares", reminding us that the distinctive mark of a Christian community is love, but love is not an automatic byproduct of a church; we create it by our choice to do things God's Way - a Love that makes a difference in someone's life, a Love that transforms lives. Christ called us to change the world, not just our Church. Real love is identified by action. God calls us to care; even in inconvenient times, we have to care more. She followed up at the 11:00 a.m. Service with "Stand Strong", emboldening us that even though answers to our prayers might get blocked and progress in our lives impeded, nothing can abort the anointing of God in our lives. God is seeking Believers who want something different; who want a fire put in their souls; who are willing to be broken, melted and molded into something new. When we are exhausted in mind, body and spirit, we must humble ourselves to receive understanding because God will send a message to touch, restore and refresh us. deeper with his message on Tuesday night entitled "Helped By A Harlot". He reminded us that anybody can help us if given a chance. There is good in the worst of us and bad in the best of us. All people are the Lord's by means of His Grace and Mercy, especially those who help others, and we should practice being kind to all. He closed out his assignment on Wednesday evening with a stirring message entitled "With An Ox-Goad". He cautioned us to be careful of exercising our authority in God's operation and conflating His Will with human agendas. Little is much in the hands of the Lord. He uses the least likely and lesser known. He just needs trusting and willing servants. We must ready ourselves for the service of the Lord.

Dr. John Kinney was our final speaker. He compelled us to "Feel The Fire", reminding us that our faith will not always lead to favor, but that it will bring fire because we dare to commit ourselves to God. We must make a commitment to an authentic covenant with God, and not our comfort; we must be willing to go through hell while others are bowing down. Neither circumstances nor conditions determine our relationship with God because He can alter the intended outcome of any consequence. Then, he brought the Revival to a bold conclusion with the message titled: "Working My Way Back To You". He reminded us that this is not the world that God created or ordained. We must get beyond the things that divide us. We have God's immutable imprint and we need to honor God's work instead of competing and hurting one another. Our presence should bring greater life. Our identity is in our creation, not our location, situation or interpretation. No one can place a limitation on our elevation or destina-

We were truly blessed by these three Vessels whom God used to revive us and to strengthen us to move forward knowing that the joy of the Lord is our strength.
