# God's Word: The Gift That Keeps On Giving Your word is a lamp to my feet And a light to my path (Psalm 119:105)

We are in the hustle and bustle of the holiday season. Sales galore, coupons and discounts, early bird specials and long lines make Christmas shopping a challenge for even the most "seasoned" shopper. The challenge is to find the best gifts and stay within a dwindling budget. Let me suggest to you the gift that may be shared daily, all it "costs" is faith enough to "believe" it is true.



That gift is the Word of God (The Bible). You might ask how this Gift keeps on giving. Think of a situation in life...any situation... and there is a word, a promise from God that is relevant for the moment. All we have to do is "look" for the biblical truth in the Word of God and apply it to our lives.

Here are just a few examples (suggested Gifts) for your consideration:

I got an ear infection in both ears which took away almost all my hearing. I wear a hearing aid to help, but it does not give me normal hearing. This greatly delayed my ability to speak.

I went to Mystic Oral School where they teach you to read lips and speak; no sign language is allowed. Then I went to American School for the Deaf from 1977 to 1984, where I also learned to sign. American School for the Deaf is the oldest school for the deaf in the USA. I played soccer, basketball and ran track. I have lived in Virginia for 12 years and really enjoy working in the Parking Ministry where we have a great team, and I can greet everyone as they come into worship.

## The Spiritual Discipline of Submission, Part 3

Let us continue our study of the book **Celebration of Discipline** by Richard J. Foster, with the 3rd of 4 "Outward" Disciplines...**Submission**. In quick review, The Outward Disciplines reveal what people need to do to improve the world around them, and they are: 1. Simplicity, 2. Solitude, 3. **Submission** and 4. Service.

In our **Submission** discussions, we recognized the legitimate authority of others over us. It is nothing more than the simple understanding that "no man/woman is an island." Paul set forth the idea in what must be considered the most memorable sentence on the subject, "submitting to one another in the fear of God" (Eph. 5:21 NKJV).

In our day, however, this body of instructions has been terribly garbled and abused. The following distortions of **Submission** reveal in part the knack we moderns have for "taking the best teaching and using it for the worst ends. What "submitting to one another" is **NOT**!!

In the November issue we described "The Doormat". Now let's describe "The Pleaser".

**The Pleaser.** This is the person who wants more than anything else to avoid conflict. He or she sees a fight coming a mile away and will go to any lengths to keep it from occurring. It is comical (and tragic) to find two "pleasers" married to each other:

"What would you like to do tonight, honey?"

"Whatever you would like, dear."

"Well, I just want to make you happy."

"And that is exactly what I want to do for you. I'll do anything that will make you happy."

"If it would please you, I would be glad to go out to dinner."

"I'd love to, if it would make you happy."

"Fine, what kind of food would you like?"

"Whatever you would enjoy, dear."

...and on it goes ad nauseam. Sounds familiar!!???

Next issue we will conclude Submission by describing "The Dependent" and "The Manipulator."



**December 1<sup>st</sup>**, "For with God nothing shall be impossible", (Luke 1:26, KJV). That was the angel's reply to Mary after she declared her virginity. There were two prophecies in this scenario; prophecies: 1) Mary would have a child, 2) Elizabeth would have a child. Elizabeth was probably not expecting to become pregnant. Mary reminds me of Sarah. "Is anything too hard for the Lord?" (Gen 18:14 KJV) How about Jeremiah 32:27, "Behold, I am the Lord, the God of all flesh. Is there anything too hard for Me?"

**On December 8**<sup>th</sup>, we receive Mary's song of praise! He has put down the mighty from their thrones, and exalted the lowly, from the song of Mary, (Luke 1:46-55 KJV). This praise jumps out of Mary and is one of the purest and humblest passages of all scripture (Luke 1:46-55). It was also prophetic! Think about what her son will do to the Romans, Sadducees, Pharisees and Scribes. They will lose power and influence. Jesus will exalt the lowly, the outcast and marginalized. "Though the Lord is on high, Yet He regards the lowly; but the proud He knows from afar." (Psalm 138:6)

**December 15th**, we hear Zechariah's Song, "He has raised up a horn of salvation for us in the house of his servant David. "And you, (John, soon to be known as John the Baptist) my child, will be called a prophet of the Most High; for you will go on before the Lord to prepare the way for him." (Luke 1:69-76 NIV) In the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar, John (as John the Baptist) said- "The voice of one crying in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the Lord." Luke 3:1-6 (NKJV).'

**December 22nd,** over 2,019 years ago, three days before what will soon be known as "Christmas", Joseph and Mary were traveling. They were tired and weary looking for a place to rest, Mary was pregnant and could deliver at any moment. The only place available was a manger. In that very same manger Jesus was born. As I read the text, I was reminded this was the beginning of the end for Jesus. Born in a manger, He will lay in a borrowed tomb. He wasn't born in a palace and was not placed in a marble sarcophagus or granite mausoleum. Why do we build such grandiose edifices and claim they are for the King of Kings?

*Fifth Sunday,* "And when they had brought their ships to land, they forsook all, and followed him." (Luke 5:11 KJV) This scripture is full of symbology. Look closely, you will see faith, commitment, dedication, devotion, an offering, and a change of lifestyle. Livelihoods were sacrificed and material wealth left behind. They wanted to follow Jesus, and what Jesus had to offer was worth more than material gain. They were looking for those things that money cannot buy, peace, liberty, justice, salvation and love; all wrapped up in the flesh called Jesus.

# "Neel! - The Birth"

Many people may know, and others may not know, that 2019 is the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Sesame Street; and for many of us, we remember as children watching Sesame Street on the Public Broadcasting Station (PBS) when it began in 1969.

Even now for some of us who are reading this article, we remember singing the song: "Sunny Day, Sweepin' the clouds away; On my way to where the air is sweet; Can you tell me how to get?!...How to get to Sesame Street."

Yes, there are quite a few of us who remember the characters and personalities of Sesame Street: like the Muppets - Bert and Ernie; Oscar the Grouch, Kermit the frog, Cookie monster and of course Big Bird. We also remember the adults who helped seal the lessons being taught- like Gordon and Susan, Maria, Luis and Mr. Hooper the storeowner. They became part of family conversations in households, classrooms and on neighborhood playgrounds.

The birth of this children's television program presented teaching and learning in fun and joyful ways; because Sesame Street educated and enthusiastically encouraged children and adults (especially parents) by shining a positive light on the joy growing up. Sesame Street became a *light for learning and living*.

As we enter into the Christmas Season, may we take a moment to center ourselves on that night that a particular birth of <u>Light</u> <u>and Joy</u> would take place and forever change our living.

"And there were in the same country shepherds abiding in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. And, lo, the angel of the Lord came upon them, and the glory of the Lord shone round about them: and they were sore afraid.

And the angel said unto them, Fear not: for, behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David <u>a Savior</u>, which is <u>Christ the</u> Lord." (Luke 2:8-11, KJV)

**NOEL**!?...We hear this word during the Christmas Season, but what does the word **Noel** mean in English?

Scholars explain that it may have been translated first from the Latin words "*Nasci*", which means "*To Be Born*", or "*Natalis*" which means "*Birth*." Then translated further from the French word "*Nael*", which also means "*Birth*." The French express a greeting "*Joyeux Noel*", which is translated "Merry Christmas" or "Happy Christmas."

So if we juxtapose the Latin and French translations, *NOEL* is "*The Birth of the Christmas Celebration!*" Simply stated, "*NOEL means Christmas!* 

So, what is the collaborated message of Sesame Street and the Christmas Season? That the reassuring hope in the Light of Noel; that Light of the Birth of JE-SUS CHRIST our SAVIOR, still shines brightly in the world today.


