Verse 1: Truly God *is* good to Israel, To such as are pure in heart.

<u>2</u>But as for me, my feet had almost stumbled; My steps had nearly slipped. <u>3</u>For I *was* envious of the boastful, When I saw the prosperity of the wicked.

<u>4</u>For *there are* no pangs in their death, But their strength *is* firm. <u>5</u>They *are* not in trouble *as other* men, Nor are they plagued like *other* men.

6 Therefore pride serves as their necklace; Violence covers them *like* a garment. 7 Their eyes bulge with abundance; They have more than heart could wish. 8 They scoff and speak wickedly concerning oppression; They speak loftily. 9 They set their mouth against the heavens, And their tongue walks through the earth. 10 Therefore his people return here, And waters of a full *cup* are drained by them.

<u>11</u>And they say, "How does God know? And is there knowledge in the Most High?" <u>12</u>Behold, these are the ungodly, Who are always at ease; They increase *in* riches.

<u>13</u>Surely I have cleansed my heart *in* vain, And washed my hands in innocence. <u>14</u>For all day long I have been plagued, And chastened every morning.
<u>15</u>If I had said, "I will speak thus," Behold, I would have been untrue to the generation of Your children.
<u>16</u>When I thought *how* to understand this, It *was* too painful for me—

<u>28</u>But *it is* good for me to draw near to God; I have put my trust in the Lord GOD, That I may declare all Your works.

27 For indeed, those who are far from You shall perish; You have destroyed all those who desert You for harlotry.

26 My flesh and my heart fail; But God is the strength of my heart and my portion forever.
25 Whom have I in heaven but You? And there is none upon earth that I desire besides You.
24 You will guide me with Your counsel, And afterward receive me to glory.
23 Nevertheless I am continually with You; You hold me by my right hand.
22 I was so foolish and ignorant; I was like a beast before You.
21 Thus my heart was grieved, And I was vexed in my mind.

20 As a dream when one awakes, So, Lord, when You awake, You shall despise their image.
19 Oh, how they are brought to desolation, as in a moment! They are utterly consumed with terrors.

<u>18</u>Surely You set them in slippery places; You cast them down to destruction.

<u>17</u>Until I went into the sanctuary of God; *Then* I understood their end.
