GOLDEN TEXT: *“That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved.” (Romans 10:9 KJV)*

Scripture Lesson Text

Romans 10:1-10

1 Brethren, my heart's desire and prayer to God for Israel is, that they might be saved.

2 For I bear them record that they have a zeal of God, but not according to knowledge.

3 For they being ignorant of God's righteousness, and going about to establish their own righteousness, have not submitted themselves unto the righteousness of God.

4 For Christ is the end of the law for righteousness to everyone that believeth.

5 For Moses described the righteousness which is of the law, That the man which doeth those things shall live by them.

6 But the righteousness which is of faith speakes on this wise, say not in thine heart, who shall ascend into heaven? (that is, to bring Christ down from above:)

7 Or, who shall descend into the deep? (that is, to bring up Christ again from the dead.)

8 But what saith it? The word is nigh thee, even in thy mouth, and in thy heart: that is, the word of faith, which we preach;

9 That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved.

10 For with the heart man believeth unto righteousness; and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation.

Lesson Aim

Facts: To study the biblical teachings of salvation by faith.

Principle: To understand that we are saved by faith and not by any human effort.

Application: To share with others the good news of salvation by faith in Jesus Christ.
