

"THE BOOK OF PSALMS"
Book V (107-150) - Psalm 150 – July 28, 2021
"Let Everything That Has Breath Praise the Lord!"

Summary: Psalm 146-150 constitutes the last of the Hallel "*praise*" collection. These five psalms are in the characteristic genre of the hymns of descriptive praise. Psalm 150 is a final doxology, bringing the Psalter to a solemn and joyful conclusion.

Psalm 150:

Praise the LORD! Praise God in His sanctuary;

Praise Him in His mighty firmament!

² Praise Him for His mighty acts; Praise Him according to His excellent greatness!

³ Praise Him with the sound of the trumpet; Praise Him with the lute and harp!

⁴ Praise Him with the timbrel and dance; Praise Him with stringed instruments and flutes!

⁵ Praise Him with loud cymbals; Praise Him with clashing cymbals!

⁶ Let everything that has breath praise the LORD. Praise the LORD!
