Our youth, parents and spiritual guides welcomed Dr. Pat Fosarelli (MD, D. Min.) into our community last month for a vital occasion to see friends, to build faith, and to experience God. As a parent, I felt like the conversation affirmed facts, dispelled myths and eased anxiety.

Dr. Fosarelli is uniquely qualified to discuss this topic. In case you weren't aware, Dr. Fosarelli currently serves as an Associate Professor of Pediatrics at Johns Hopkins University and Associate Dean of the Ecumenical Institute at St. Mary's Seminary and University in Baltimore. We gathered for a presentation and conversation with Dr. Pat Fosarelli, author of "How to Talk to Children and Teens About COVID-19", to discuss themes like God, faith and COVID-19. Some of our questions were:

- Is God trying to tell us something through this COVID crisis? If so, what?
- What has been your greatest challenge during the COVID-19 pandemic?
- How long does it take for COVID to take over the body?
- Will we ever get to stop wearing masks?
- Will I need a booster shot?

No questions were too silly or too serious. We even contemplated why doesn't God stop the coronavirus? While I don't have the space to recount the details of our dialogue, here are a few lessons learned during this time:

- Care about everyone in the world, not just us;
- Don't waste time a single day;
- Lean on God;
- You're not in control, only God is...

LEADERSHIP THE CHARLAINS CORNER

"Happy early CHRISTmas, FMZ Family!!" Please see the FMZ Leadership First Friday Prayer and Fasting Devotional from November.

The October sub-title was "God, What's Going On!?" Interesting enough, the saying "what's going on?" came up at the October 30th Men's Ministry Zoom Conference. So here we go!! The first speaker said Marvin Gaye asked the question, "what's going on?" We should ask: 1. What's going on? 2. Why is it going on? and better; 3. What's next? He also said we must Live by Godly Principle; Obligate ourselves to your community/church; Validate our Faith through our service, action, and word, and Engage life each day through Faith, confidence, and purpose, and be an example for others to follow.

The second speaker asked the question, What is our response to "What's going on around us". He said we needed to (1) Get our Devotion together; (2) Get our Desire right. and (3) Get our Decision right!! (Joshua 24:14-15). And then the Pastor wrapped it up by saying to the men on the Zoom conference.... "Keep it going on!!"

Talk it over: Wow!! Lots of "goings on's !!!" So where do we GO from here??? Let's try scripture, Hebrew 13:1-6 (NLT)!! 13: (1) Keep on loving each other as brothers and sisters. (2) Don't forget to show hospitality to strangers, for some who have done this have entertained angels without realizing it! (3) Remember those in prison, as if you were there yourself. Remember also those being mistreated, ask if you felt their pain in your own bodies. And how about this we must (1) Present our bodies daily as living sacrifices (Rom 12:1); (2) Hunger and thirst after righteousness daily (Matt.5:6), and (3) Choose to serve God 'til Jesus come (Matt. 24:9-14)!!

Finally, my Brethren and "Sisteren," we must listen to the Voice of God, through God's Word and Holy Spirit (The Teacher). No matter "What is going on!!" God's got it!!! Jesus said, "I will never leave you nor forsake you!" Once again, the Pastor said to "keep it going on!!" Now, we ALL should have confirmation in our assignment!! This time of year brings a unique opportunity to reflect to think about what has been, what is, and what lies ahead as the new year approaches. BLACK HISTORY CORNER

Spiritual journeys or pilgrimages are ripe sources of nourishment for the soul. A recent one centered on three cities in Alabama that were infamous for their stubborn and graphic occasions where human dignity and value collided with violence and racial tensions. Any attempt to accurately describe the horrors of the day would fail. Montgomery was the site of the Montgomery Bus Boycott, a successful Christian-led Movement that was initiated by Rosa Parks and ultimately led by Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Selma's Edmund Pettis Bridge was the site of "Bloody Sunday," when law enforcement officers brutally attacked peacefully voting rights advocates. And then, Birmingham demands study and prayerful consideration due to the bombing of the 16th Street Baptist Church and the Children's Crusades. The bombing resulted in the death of four girls and many injuries. The Crusades centered around teenagers and children who were jailed as a part of strategy to overwhelm the system and to expose its indiscriminate horror. As I look at this with fresh eyes, the biblical mandate to "love your enemies" takes new meaning. Let's discuss it.



The Women's Ministry (WM) concluded our 2-day Ministry event with a conference via Zoom on Nov 6th. The ladies showed up looking lovely in their red and gold to support our conference colors. We surprisingly had a few men from the Men's Ministry join us for this blessed time in the Lord.

The morning began with a video, "Never Lost a Battle" by CeCe Winans. This selection set the tone by reminding us that our God is still in control, and He can do all things but fail. Our Mistress of Ceremony, Demetria Cobb, did an amazing job as she lovingly and encouragingly led us through the morning. She opened and ushered in the presence of the Lord by instructing us to take ourselves off mute and give God praise for 30 seconds. The day included scripture readings that were gracefully read by Betty Palmer, Terry Carey, and Michelle Barnes. Rev. Sharon Wallace opened the conference with a Spirit-filled prayer. The WM Co-Director, Gwen L. Holland, provided warm and welcoming introductions for all three of our guest speakers. The day also included praise and worship selections that were beautifully rendered by Breh Stevens Mitchell, Evangelist Beverly Johnson, and Psalmist Cynthia Wilson.

Our 1st guest speaker, Rev. Dr. Brennetta Williams, delivered a powerful message encouraging us to "Keep Your Focus Fixed on God." She reminded us that we can have joy despite the challenges we are going through. She gave

example of the Israelites seeing the vision and then walking in the victory. (Deuteronomy 31:6) They were at their "inbetween place" of promise and possession. The "in-between place" is where we lose focus. She encouraged us, while experiencing the "in-between place," to "Keep our Eyes Fixed on God." She reminded us to "Worship While We Wait." Dr. Williams instructed us to type that affirmation of faith in the chat. We need to declare that we haven't seen our best days yet. She went on to tell us of how Moses reminded the Israelites to go back to the promises of God and how He had done all He said He would do. She said we must position ourselves to receive the promise. We have to continue to pursue the promise. We have to be courageous while waiting for the promise to come to pass. Dr. Williams had us proclaim that "We are Winning Women!" We have to allow our faith to override our fear. God is with us and His presence gives us peace, protection and power. When God gives you a promise, you can take it to the bank and cash it! She concluded by saying that if you "Keep Your Focus on God," your joy will be complete.

During Part II of our conference, we had the pleasure of hearing a very inspirational testimony by our beloved Assistant Pastor, Rev. Dr. Sandra K. James. She started off by saying "This Is the Day That the Lord Has Made, Let Us Rejoice and Be Glad in It"! Dr. James shared how the Lord has been good to her while being a caregiver for her mother and through her experience with death of family members.







She shared that she and her family contracted COVID-19. The Lord kept her and her family in the midst of the pain and suffering. Through it all she trusted God in knowing that the prayers of the righteous availed much. They all survived! She proclaimed, "I don't look like what I've been through. Had it not been for the Lord on my side, where would I be? My soul shouts hallelujah!" She ended her testimony with the same way that she started it. "This Is the Day That the Lord Has Made, Let Us Rejoice and Be Glad in It!"

Our 2nd guest speaker, Rev. Kaiya Jennings, also delivered a powerful message entitled "God Masters in Making a Way." She gave the example of being stuck in 95 traffic on her way to an event. She experienced within herself impatience and frustration because she had somewhere to be. All of a sudden her GPS spoke letting her know there was another route she could take. What a relief! When we are faced with obstacles, the Lord will make a highway for you to get around it. When the mountain shows up in your life, "God Masters in Making a Way." Rev. Jennings expressed that God puts a hedge of protection around His people, protecting us from dangers both seen and unseen. He will never permit the righteous to be moved. (Psalm 55:22). She said that we need to understand that our God has the ability to step into time and space and make a miracle happen just for us. We serve a God that will keep His promises. His Word will not return back void. He may not come when you want Him to, but He's always on time. Rev. Jennings ended by encouraging us to trust in God and wait on Him; He will show up and do what we need Him to do, because "God Masters in Making a Way."

As we entered Part III, the final stages of our conference, we watched a very encouraging "Keep Your Eyes on God," PowerPoint created by Gwen L. Holland. The presentation highlighted many of God's promises. Choosing to stand on God's promises is what will get us through the storms.

Our 3rd guest speaker, Rev. Dr. MarQuita Carmichael, closed out our conference with a powerful Word. She ministered to us about the Disciples being on the boat during a bad storm. Some of them were fishermen and knew what to do so they shouldn't have been shaken up by the storm, but they were. They cried out to each other in their panicking. Afterwards, they went to Jesus who was asleep in the boat. Dr. Carmichael encouraged us by telling us that we don't have to cry out like the Disciples did, but remind ourselves that God hasn't forgotten about us, so have faith. Keep God as the "Center of our Joy," as she referenced the song sung earlier by Breh. We need to get in formation and assume the posture of prayer. She reminded us that God has planted Himself in the center of our heart, our soul, and in our storm. God speaks to the storm, not the people. Dr. Carmichael encouraged us by telling us that we are God's greatest joy. We are the carriers of His truth. We are the salt that gives the world its flavor. She reminded us that "They that

wait on the Lord, shall renew their strength." (Isaiah 40:31). In closing, Dr. Carmichael told us to "Walk together children, don't you get weary. The Lord knows where you are and the Lord is concerned about you. The Lord is everlasting and there is Nobody Greater;" referencing a song sang during the conference by Psalmist Wilson.

Before closing, Rev. Maxine Thompson gave the invitation to Christian Discipleship and prayed for those that are lost and haven't accepted Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior.

Our conference was full of praise, worship, and thanksgiving from beginning to end. I provided the following words of encouragement in closing: "The best way to face challenges is to deal with them one day at a time. Sometimes our trials can seem overwhelming and almost impossible to get through, but we must lean not on our own understanding, trust in the Lord, read and meditate on the Word of God and stay in prayer. The Bible tells us to rejoice always, pray without ceasing and in everything give thanks. Keep Your Eyes on God, He is the Joy in Your Storm."

Rev. Dr. Tracey Dawkins Holley continually gave thanks as her heart was full of thanksgiving and praise for all that had taken place over the 2-day WM events. She was heartfelt in her appreciation for everyone that took part in planning, executing, and sharing during the concert and conference. Rev. Dr. Sandra K. James ended the conference with a powerful prayer that covered and blessed us all. To God be the glory!

We are all familiar with celestial seasons: Spring, Summer, Fall and Winter. Similarly, are you aware that each of us has seasons in our lives? These seasons allow God to stretch us, minister to us, build us up, and test our character. To grow closer to the Lord in these seasons, we must first answer the call. The Call is to become one of God's disciples, which is the best decision we could ever make! Why does God call us? God calls us so that we might participate in His plan. He calls because He loves us. God has given all of us a purpose (Jeremiah 29:11). Sometimes we can struggle to see our purpose, but it's in those seasons that God reveals to us through His Word the specific plan for our lives.

The season of Spring is a time in which you start planting. You commit to fulfill God's plan for your life and your desire to be in communion with Him.

Summer is the season of growing. Growth always begins with obedience (John 14:15), "if you love me, you will keep My commandments." In the words of Dr. Evans, "Growth prepares us and creates capacity for what God is calling us to do. Obedience to God's plan is rarely easy to do. Many times, it may require us to do something we never wanted to do! It may mean wrestling with unruly emotions, or overcoming prejudices and preconceived notions." The first step of obedience is spending time with the Father in His Word through quiet time. Quiet time is time we set aside just to hear God's voice and become more familiar with Him and His Word. If we are not familiar with His Word, how can we know Him, His voice, or His plan for our lives? Many times, the Lord calls us to serve in this season. Sometimes that service can be in the form of things mundane or not in our comfort zone. This is a process of stretching us.

In the process of stretching, we learn the spiritual gifts that God has graced us with, which are different than our talents. Talent is having a natural aptitude or skill for something. The gifts the Holy Spirit endows us with are wisdom, faith, knowledge, faith, healing, working of miracles, prophecy, discerning of spirits, tongues, and interpretation of tongues (1 Corinthians 12:7-10 NKJV). These gifts, the Father bestows on us to further the kingdom and help us complete our ministries. FMZBC offers a spiritual gifts assessment. You can also find free assessments online. These assessments will help you understand how God may be using you in certain situations. More importantly, are you using your gifts? Are you allowing God to prepare you so that you can stand when the storms of life come your way? When God anoints us for life in His kingdom, we have to believe that He knows what He is doing and trust His timing in our season of growth as we go through the season of preparation.

As we learn how to utilize our gifts, we then reap the season of harvest, Fall. In this season, because we are reaping the bounty

we sowed, we can become complacent. We sit back and think our work is done...far from such! Our work is never done in the Kingdom of God. We simply go from one season to another. However, we can learn to become content. To be grateful or satisfied for what is, while still expectantly looking towards the future! "This is also a time when fear can creep in and is a spirit in which we must quard against." God tells us in His Word, "Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be frightened, and do not be dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go." (Joshua 1:9 NKJV). Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name; you are Mine! (Isaiah 43:1 NKJV). God tells us this because He knows that fear can paralyze us, make us afraid to step into our calling, and not share the Word with others. This is exactly what the enemy wants. Fear is a distraction the enemy uses to keep us from deepening our dependence and trust in our Heavenly Father. Fear will take your eyes off Jesus and make you feel as if you're sinking. But the Word tells us in (1 Timothy 1:7 NKJV), "For God has not given us a spirit of fear, but of power and of love and a sound mind." When we give in to fear, we are no longer living the victorious life we were meant to live in Christ. Let your faith be bigger than your fear! We must Believe and Act like God is telling the truth! We often find ourselves having to be patient in this process, but no matter what season, we must learn to trust God and all the promises He has given us in His Word. Trust Him in the storms and trust Him when the storm has passed and the sun shines again. For the battle is not ours, but it's the Lord's. God's intentions for us as we allow Him and look to Him to work in our lives is probably best identified in this acrostic:

Sovereignty of God Elevation by God Assistance from God Submission to God Opportunities from God Needs met by God Salvation by God

Do not give in to fear! Act in faith! Trust God and let Him do what He does best, which is to take care of the children He loves!

You might be in a season of Winter, a season that might be challenging. However, this is a time to be still and lean into the Father and know that He is at work in it all. The Word tells us, "He who dwells in the shelter of the Most High will abide in the shadow of the Almighty." (Psalm 91:1 NKJV). When we remember and trust that our Father really does have our back, no matter how bleak the situation may look, we can trust in the promises He has given us. "Blessed is the man who trusts in the Lord, and whose hope is the Lord, for he shall be like a tree planted by the waters, which spreads out its roots by the river; and will not fear when heat comes; But its leaf will be green and will not be anxious in the year of drought, nor will cease from yielding fruit." (Jeremiah 17:7-8).

As God's children, we will go through seasons of change. But remember our "Daddy" has our back! His promises are true and His Word does not return void. When we commune with Him daily, read His Word, serve with the gifts the Holy Spirit has endowed in us, it won't matter what season we're in because we know that He has a plan and purpose for our lives and we can be confident in His assurance.
