A King Comes Forth¹

Lesson Text: **Isaiah 9:6-7; John 12:12-16**

Related Scriptures: **Micah 5:2; Psalm 118:22-29; Zechariah 9:9; Matthew 21:4-9; Mark 11:7-10; Luke 19:35-38**

TIME: 733 B.C. A.D. 30

PLACE: Jerusalem

GOLDEN TEXT: *“They Took branches of palm trees, and went forth to meet him, and cried, Hosanna: Blessed is the King of Israel that cometh in the name of the Lord.” (John12:13 KJV)*

Scripture Lesson Text

Isaiah 9:6-7

6 For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given: and the government shall be upon his shoulder: and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, The mighty God, The everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace.

7 Of the increase of his government and peace there shall be no end, upon the throne of David, and upon his kingdom, to order it, and to establish it with judgment and with justice from henceforth even forever. The zeal of the Lord of hosts will perform this.

John 12:12-16

12 On the next day much people that were come to the feast, when they heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem,

13 Took branches of palm trees, and went forth to meet him, and cried, Hosanna: Blessed is the King of Israel that cometh in the name of the Lord.

14 And Jesus, when he had found a young ass, sat thereon; as it is written,

15 Fear not, daughter of Sion: behold, thy King cometh, sitting on an ass's colt.

16 These things understood not his disciples at the first: but when Jesus was glorified, then remembered they that these things were written of him, and that they had done these things unto him.

Lesson Aim

Facts: To know that Isaiah prophesied the birth of a King centuries before Jesus entered Jerusalem as that King.

Principle: To recognize Jesus as the King who brings peace with God and eternal life by conquering sin.

Application: To accept His gift of peace and to follow His example and live peacefully with those who oppose and persecute us.

Introduction

Isaiah made an astounding prophecy over seven centuries before Jesus was born which gave hope for God's people. God would send a Messiah, His anointed One, who would overthrow all the oppressive governments of the world and establish His never-ending kingdom. The fulfillment of this prophecy was inaugurated when Jesus Christ entered Jerusalem over seven hundred years later as not only the king of the Jews, but as the king of kings.
