## Jesus' Arrest<sup>1</sup>

Lesson Text: **John 18:1-13;**

Related Scriptures:

**John 11:45-53; Matthew 26:36-57;**

**Mark 14:26-50; Luke 22:39-53**

**TIME:** A.D. 30

**PLACES:** Jerusalem

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**GOLDEN TEXT:** *“That the saying might be fulfilled, which he spoke, of them which thou gavest me have I lost none.” (John 18:9 KJV)*

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### *Scripture Lesson Text*

#### **John 18:1-13**

1 When Jesus had spoken these words, he went forth with his disciples over the brook Cedron, where was a garden, into the which he entered, and his disciples.

**2 And Judas also, which betrayed him, knew the place: for Jesus oftentimes resorted thither with his disciples.**

3 Judas then, having received a band of men and officers from the chief priests and Pharisees, cometh thither with lanterns and torches and weapons.

**4 Jesus therefore, knowing all things that should come upon him, went forth, and said unto them, whom seek ye?**

5 They answered him, Jesus of Nazareth. Jesus saith unto them, I am he. And Judas also, which betrayed him, stood with them.

**6 As soon then as he had said unto them, I am he, they went backward, and fell to the ground.**

7 Then asked he them again, Whom seek ye? And they said, Jesus of Nazareth.

**8 Jesus answered, I have told you that I am he: if therefore ye seek me, let these go their way:**

9 That the saying might be fulfilled, which he spake, Of them which thou gavest me have I lost none.

**10 Then Simon Peter having a sword drew it, and smote the high priest's servant, and cut off his right ear. The servant's name was Malchus.**

11 Then said Jesus unto Peter, put up thy sword into the sheath: the cup which my Father hath given me, shall I not drink it?

**12 Then the band and the captain and officers of the Jews took Jesus, and bound him,**

13 And led him away to Annas first; for he was father-in-law to Caiaphas, which was the high priest that same year.

### **Lesson Aim**

**Facts:** To know that Jesus was never guilty of any sin or wrongdoing, yet He was arrested when Judas Iscariot betrayed Him.

**Principle:** To recognize that Jesus willingly bore our sin and to note that He understands the pain that betrayal brings.

**Application:** To always stand for Christ even if it is unpopular with those closest to us.

### **Introduction**

Jesus had just completed His high priestly prayer and crossed over Kidron Valley after exiting Jerusalem. There, He entered a garden known as Gethsemane (cf. Mark 14:32). As Jesus agonized in prayer over what He was about to endure, a band of soldiers came with torches and weapons to arrest him.
