
LENT: A TIME OF PERSONAL REFLECTION

Lent is the six-week period (March 2nd-April 14th) leading up to Easter. It is one of the most important times of the year for many Christians. Lent is a time for personal reflection, looking inward, a time of solemn observance and preparation for the celebration of the death and resurrection of Jesus on Resurrection Sunday (Easter).

Lent traditionally is a time of prayer and fasting or giving something up. Lent invites us to ready our hearts and minds for remembering Jesus' life, death and resurrected body. Honoring what Jesus "gave up," "sacrificed" for us at Calvary's cross.

The Matthew 4:1-11 text studied in Bible Study on March 2nd and our preaching text on communion Sunday, March 6th, reminds us of what it means to be tempted and be an overcomer. Jesus is our perfect example. I encourage you to spend more time with this text as a part of your Lent devotional, let Jesus lead you in times of temptation and trials and when you find yourself in the "wilderness," search the Word of God for the appropriate response... and let you answer be "it is written." 

SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE

Applications are now being accepted for High School Seniors attending post -secondary schools. The application can be found on the website at www.firstmountzionbc.org

The student must meet the following qualifications to apply:

- Been a member of FMZBC for at least one year prior to the deadline of April 15, 2022;
- Been accepted by an institution of higher learning; and
- Must meet other requirements contained in the Scholarship Booklet.

The deadline for applications is April 15, 2022.

The scholarship requirements have been changed from previous years to accommodate students who were unable to participate in a Church ministry due to COVID-19 restrictions and FMZBC closure during those restrictions. The major change is students who were unable to participate in a Church ministry can apply for, and receive, a scholarship. Other changes include elimination of the points system and the optional community service. Also, students are not required to get in-person signatures on documents, but may get email verification and/or electronic signatures as required. These changes apply to 2022 graduating seniors only. Students can pick up a paper copy of the Scholarship Booklet at the Church or get a copy online at the Church's website, where more detailed information is posted.

Prayer and Fasting Topic: Anchoring our Souls

Sub-Topic: Soul 101: Soul/Body/Mind/Will/History-making

Discussion: The soul is the capacity to integrate all the parts into a single, whole life. It is something like a program that runs a computer; you don't usually notice it unless it messes up. "According to Dallas, the soul seeks harmony, connection, and integration. That is why integrity is such a deep soul-word. The human soul seeks to integrate our will and our mind and our body into an integral person. Beyond that, the soul seeks to connect us with other people, with creation, and with God Almighty — Who made us to be rooted in Him the way a tree is rooted by a life-giving stream (Ps 1). This is so true that the word soul, in both the Old and New Testaments and elsewhere in the ancient world, is often simply a synonym for the person. Even in our day it is interesting how our language reflects this. Questions on airplane or ship records sometimes ask, "How many souls on board?" Most people have no idea where this comes from, but it traces its origins to the ancient world. For example, in Acts 27:37, Luke reports on a shipwreck involving the apostle Paul: "And we were all in the ship two hundred threescore and sixteen [276] souls."

Your soul is what integrates your will (your intentions), your mind (your thoughts and feelings, your values and conscience), and your body (your face, body language, and actions) into a single life. A soul is healthy — well-ordered — when there is harmony between these three entities and God's intent for all creation. When you are connected with God AND other people in life, you have a healthy soul."

Lesson: So, in commemoration of Women's History Month, let us corporately pray and fast over the "souls" of those women "who are/were connected with God and other people in life." 

Holy Communion, The Lord's Supper, is celebrated on the first Sunday of each month, Easter, Maundy Thursday or at any other times determined by the Pastor. Just as Jesus served his disciples in an intimate gathering in the Upper Room with an element of uniqueness and sacredness, we should have similar reverence when we partake of Holy Communion. Consider how you setup or prepare for communion in your home. An elegant simplicity or richly ornate setting gives the reverence needed to give honor to the service of Holy Communion.

During this continued pandemic when we are not all worshipping together, consider including these items as a guide for preparing for Communion at home:

- ♦ A table runner or place mat
- ♦ A tablecloth
- A wine cup and a bread plate or the prefilled communion elements
- A cross or candle or bible
- Materials to clean your hands
- Another tablecloth or napkin to cover the elements until the service of Communion is served

There's no hard rule for preparing Communion at home; however, setting the table and making it ready for the Pastor's blessing will reflect our desires to worship and honor Jesus for His death, burial, and resurrection for our eternal salvation.

We should also remember this table is not our table; it is the table of Jesus Christ. We are invited by Him, to come to this table. So, we accept His offer when we participate in Holy Communion.

This Covid 19 season shall pass, and we will once again assemble, embrace one another in Christian love, stand stronger together, and celebrate the body and blood of Jesus Christ through participating in Holy Communion, the Lord's Supper together.

SIGNIFICANT EVENTS IN BLACK HISTORY DURING APRIL

April 1816

The African Methodist Episcopal Church was organized as the first independent black denomination in the United States

April 1947

Jackie Robinson signed a contract with the Brooklyn, Dodgers baseball team. He played his first game with them on April 15th.

April 1963

Dr. Martin Luther Jr. was arrested for leading protests in Birmingham, Alabama. On April 16th, while still in jail, he wrote his applauded "Letter From a Birmingham Jail." On April 3, 1968, Dr. King gave his final speech "I've Been to the Mountaintop." The next day, **April 4th, 1968**, he was assassinated.

April 1964

Nelson Mandela was **c**harged with sabotage, and delivered a statement during his trial in Pretoria that revealed the depth of his resolve in the fight against apartheid and his willingness to lay down his life in an effort to end white racist rule. "During my lifetime I have dedicated myself to this struggle of the African people," Mandela said.

April 1974

James Alan McPherson received the Pulitzer Prize in Fiction for Elbow Room, a book of short stories that explore the border-line between black and white America.

C. R. Patterson & Sons Company was the first Black-owned automobile manufacturer in the United States. It was initially started by a former slave, Charles Richard Patterson, and his eldest son, who took the family business to greater heights in the early 20th Century. Patterson was a former slave who escaped captivity in Virginia, then settled in Greenfield, Ohio. While working as a blacksmith for various local horse-drawn carriage companies, he became friendly with white carriage company owner, J.P. Lowe. The pair went into business together in 1873 and maintained a successful business relationship. In 1893, Patterson split with his partner and began C.R. Patterson & Sons. The company enjoyed some early success but the automobile industry's evolution impacted the horse-powered vehicles Patterson specialized in. After Patterson died in 1910, his son, Richard, took over the family business. The younger Patterson, who was the first Black football player at Ohio State University, debuted the company's first Patterson-Greenfield automobile. The car sold for \$850 and was reportedly a superior vehicle to the vaunted Model T Ford that debuted in 1908. Because of the Great Depression business was impacted negatively and they eventually closed doors in 1939.
