## Lesson Text: Isaiah 6:1-8

### Related Scriptures:

**Exodus 33:12-20; Psalm 89:1-8; Matthew 17:1-7; Revelation 1:12-20**

**TIME:** 739 B.C.

**PLACES:** Jerusalem

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**GOLDEN TEXT:** "One cried unto another and said, "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of His glory." (*1<sup>st</sup> Samuel 3:10*) *Corinthians 10:5 KJV*)

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### *Scripture Lesson Text*

#### ***Isaiah 6:1-8***

1 In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw also the Lord sitting upon a throne, high and lifted up, and His train filled the temple.

**2 Above it stood the seraphims; each one had six wings: with two he covered his face, and with two he covered his feet, and with two he flew.**

3 And one cried unto another and said, "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of His glory."

**4 And the posts of the door moved at the voice of him that cried, and the house was filled with smoke.**

5 Then said I, "Woe is me! For I am undone, because I am a man of unclean lips and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips; for mine eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts."

**6 Then flew one of the seraphims unto me, having a live coal in his hand, which he had taken with the tongs from off the altar.**

7 And he laid it upon my mouth and said, "Lo, this hath touched thy lips; and thine iniquity is taken away, and thy sin purged."

**8 Also I heard the voice of the Lord saying, “Whom shall I send, and who will go for Us?” Then said I, “Here am I. Send me!”**

### **Lesson Aim**

**Facts:** To discover how seeing God’s holiness motivates us to be his faithful servants.

**Principle:** To see that our service of God directly correlates with our understanding of His character. The more we love and worship Him, the better we will serve Him.

**Application:** To use what we learn about God’s holiness to submit our hearts to Him and grow in eagerness to serve Him.

### **Introduction**

In Isaiah 6, the Prophet Isaiah is given a rare glimpse of worship in Heaven. When he sees this perfect worship, he realizes the depth of his sin and his need to offer himself up to God as a servant. This reaction, a reaction of humility and service-is our only possible response to seeing God in all His Glory. The turning of our hearts towards God will lead us to repentance and submission to His will.
