

Sub-Topic: Corporate Prayer: Saved Souls Praying for
Saved and Unsaved Souls

**Source:** Bible YouVersion Devotional: *Moorings - Anchor for the Soul* /Soul Keeping – John Ortberg

**Discussion:** Last First Friday, we explored a type of prayer called "corporate prayer." Corporate prayer is the term used to describe praying together with other people - in small groups or larger gatherings of people. In our case, we are praying "corporately" on a common devotional focus and prayer list but in our separate venues, YET in Oneness by the Holy Spirit! We submit, that considering what we have just witnessed in Uvalde Texas, Buffalo, Tulsa, and elsewhere, God's People need to pray corporately with more fervor than ever before!!

### Lesson:

"Then if my people who are called by my name will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, I will hear from heaven and will forgive their sins and restore their land. My eyes will be open and my ears attentive to every prayer made in this place. For I have chosen this Temple and set it apart to be holy—a place where my name will be honored forever. I will always watch over it, for it is dear to my heart." 2 Chronicles 7:14-16 NLT

2 Chronicles 7:14. In chapter 6, Solomon asked God to make provisions for the people when they sinned. God answered with four conditions for forgiveness: (1) Humble yourself by admitting your sins, (2) pray to God, asking for forgiveness, (3) seek "God continually, and (4) turn from sinful behavior. *True repentance is more than talk—it is changed behavior.* Whether we sin individually, as a group, OR AS A NATION, following these steps will lead to forgiveness. God will answer our earnest prayers."

So, our Brothers and Sisters, let us hear the clarion call to Pray (and Fast) corporately, to the end that God "heals our land."







### SIGNIFICANT EVENTS IN BLACK HISTORY DURING JULY

On **July 8, 1777** – The <u>Vermont Republic</u> (a sovereign nation at the time) abolished slavery, the first future state to do so. No slaves were held in Vermont.

In **July 1794**, two independent black churches open in Philadelphia: the African Episcopal Church of St. Thomas, with Absalom Jones, and the Bethel African Methodist Episcopal Church, with Richard Allen, the latter the first church of what would become in 1816 the first independent black denomination in the United States.

In **July 1822**, Denmark Vesey (also Telemaque) was an early 19th century free Black pastor and community leader in Charleston, South Carolina, who was accused and convicted of planning a major slave revolt. Although the alleged plot was discovered before it could be realized, its potential scale stoked the fears of the antebellum planter class that led to increased restrictions on both slaves and free blacks.

On **July 5, 1852** Frederick Douglass gave a speech that is now known as the "What To The Slave Is The 4th Of July" speech. Douglass was asked to give a speech on July 4th during a commemoration of the Declaration of Independence. However he choose to give one on July 5th instead. When Douglass gave his speech he acknowledged the signers of the Declaration of Independence but he made it clear that there was too much work to be done before the 4th of July would be a day of celebration for Blacks.

In July 1905 a group of Black activists and intellectuals met on the Canadian side of Niagara Falls to discuss the issue of civil liberties for African Americans. That meeting was the start of *The Niagara Movement*. The group had planned to meet on the New York side of the Falls, but were forced to change location after being denied accommodations. The organization, formed by W.E.B Du Bois (I) and William Monroe Trotter (r), was made up of critics of Booker T. Washington, President of Tuskegee Institute. During this period, Washington was viewed by most as the authority figure on issues that concerned Black Americans. Washington's view that Black Americans should help themselves, while being patient and accommodating, was denounced by members of the Niagara Movement, who demanded that blacks be granted the same rights and liberties as whites.

In **July 1943**, The Tuskegee Airmen had its first aerial victory when Lieutenant Charles B. Hall, of the 99th Pursuit Squadron, shot down a German fighter plane.

In **July 1975**, Arthur Ashe became the first Black man to win the tennis championship at Wimbledon.



# Outreach

Wonderful news! The Women's Ministry Outreach is back up and running under the leadership of Sister Cynthia Wilson, Outreach Lead. Please join me in thanking her for listening to God's call, and for allowing Him to work through her with Outreaches that will not only honor Him but help those in need.

Our first Outreach Event, which was held in April 2022, was just within the Women's Ministry. Sister Cynthia along with Sister Shalem asked that we support Entrusted Connections Life House (ECLH) which is located in Manassas, VA, and provides housing in a Christian environment for women who are transitioning from incarceration. Ex-offenders can stay in the program for up to two years, but have to attend weekly Bible study sessions and secure a job.

We collected an over-abundance of items which will help provide the care needed for the women.

We had our second drive on June 4, 2022 and again, we were grateful for the support received. This drive was held to support the Hilda Barg Homeless Prevention Shelter & Northern Virginia Family Services. We will be holding our last Outreach for this year in October, and everyone will be asked to participate. Please stay tuned for more information regarding what items will be needed, as we get closer to the collection date.
