GOLDEN TEXT: "The Lord knows the days of the upright, and their inheritance shall be forever." (Psalm 37:18)

Scripture Lesson Text

Micah 2:4-11

4 In that day shall one take up a parable against you, and lament with a doleful lamentation and say, 'We are utterly despoiled; He has changed the portion of my people. How has He removed it from me! Turning away, He has divided our fields."

5 Therefore thou shall have none that shall cast a cord by lot in the congregation of the Lord.

6 "Prophesy you not," say they to them that prophesy: "They shall not prophesy to them, that they shall not suffer shame."

7 Oh you that are named the house of Jacob: Is the Spirit of the Lord straitened? Are these His doings? Do not My words do good to him that walk upright?

8 "Even of late My people have risen as an enemy; ye pull off the robe with the garment from them that pass by trustingly as men returning from war.

9 The women of My people have you cast out from their pleasant houses; from their children have you taken away My glory forever.

10 Arise you and depart, for this is not your rest; because it is polluted it shall destroy you, even with a sore destruction.

Lesson Aim

Application: To listen to those who lift the word of God and urge us to obey it despite our fleshly desires.
