We are honored to welcome as our guest preacher, the highly acclaimed and internationally known preacher, Bishop Vashti Murphy McKenzie. Bishop McKenzie currently serves as the Interim President and General Secretary of the National Council of Churches. Prior to this assignment, Bishop McKenzie served as the 117th elected and consecrated Bishop of the African Methodist




Episcopal Church. She was the first woman to be elected to hold this episcopal office in the more than two century-old AME Church and is the first woman to serve as President of the Council of Bishops and President of the General Board. Additionally, Bishop McKenzie serves as the National Chaplain of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc.

The Anniversary theme is "From Generation to Generation-Growing Deeper, Growing Stronger, Reaching Higher." The scripture reference is Deuteronomy 32:7 "Remember the days of old, Consider the years of many generations. Ask your father and he will show you; Your elders, and they will tell you."

The month of October will feature several activities leading to the Anniversary Worship Service and celebration. These activities include: the unveiling of new flagpole and narthex banners; the distribution of Anniversary key rings; and tree planting and mortgage-burning ceremonies.

GRIEF SHARE

A Journey from Mourning to Joy

WHAT IS GRIEFSHARE?

Grief is difficult to bear, especially if you try to do it on your own. Allow us to help you heal. At First Mount Zion Baptist Church through our Journey to Joy Grief Ministry, we host a grief support group program called GriefShare. GriefShare is a 13-week program that provides a safe place weekly for group members to share their feelings and their grief stories. The 13-week, small group seminar, is a Christcentered and biblically-based support program. GriefShare is for people who have lost a spouse, child, other family member, or friend, through death. A grieving person can join the group at any time. Participants will learn about griefrelated issues. A video is shown each week featuring experts, ministers, and Christian Counselors discussing grief and recovery subjects helpful to people who are grieving. The video also features people sharing their stories of what has helped them deal with the pain of losing a family member or friend through death. During the week between meetings, group members use their workbooks to complete a daily Bible study and practical exercises to help them heal from grief. After watching the video during the group session, a small group discussion about the video is held. A workbook is required and will be provided to registered participants. Participants must register online at https:// www.griefshare.org/. You will find that these seminars will provide comfort, answers, and hope. Currently, Journey to Joy does not offer GriefShare seminars for children. The seminars are held on Mondays from 7:00-9:00P.M. via Zoom. The next 13-week seminar will begin Monday, September 19-December 19, 2022.

Other grief seminars being hosted by First Mount Zion Baptist Church are: **Loss of a Spouse**, which will be held on Monday, September 12, 2022, and **Surviving the Holidays**, will be held on Monday, November 14, 2022. 





Prayer and Fasting Topic: Anchoring our Souls

Source: : Bible YouVersion Devotional: Moorings - Anchor for the Soul /Soul Keeping - John Ortberg

Discussion: Have you heard the saying, "Confession is good for the soul"? This exact statement is not in the Bible, but the principle of confessing our sins is. Some believe that the idiom "Confession is good for the soul" is Scottish in origin. Regardless, it is saying that admitting our errors is good for us, easing the burden of carrying the guilt we feel if nothing else. The spiritual object of confession is to help the individual "cleanse their soul."

Lesson: A true follower of Jesus Christ is one who believes in God and strives to live by every word of God. What does the Bible say about confession and forgiveness of sin?

In the Old Testament, God required of Israel that when a person sinned, "...when he realizes it, then he shall be guilty.... he shall confess that he has sinned..." (Leviticus 5:4-5).

Some sins required *confession* and restitution (Numbers 5:6–7). God sent Nathan the prophet to King David after he committed adultery with Bathsheba and arranged for the murder of her husband, Uriah (2 Samuel 11). After Nathan showed David his sin, David confessed to Nathan, "I have sinned against the Lord" (2 Samuel 12:1-13).

John the Baptist paved the way for Jesus Christ's ministry through preaching repentance and baptizing those who confessed their sins (Matthew 3:1-6).

The Apostle Paul said, paraphrasing Isaiah 45:23: "As I live, says the Lord, every knee shall bow to Me, and every tongue shall confess to God" (Romans 14:11).

Why do we need to confess our sins to God? Proverbs 28:13 tells us, "He who covers (hides, conceals) his sins will not prosper, but whoever confesses and forsakes them will have mercy." Simply put, we need to see our sins, confess and acknowledge our sins to God, repent of our sins, ask God's forgiveness for our sins, which was made possible by Jesus' sacrifice for our sins, and strive to sin no more.

The Apostle John said, "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from ALL unrighteousness" (1 John 1:9). So, in that sense, confession is "good for the soul."

This "Helper" who Jesus mentions is God's Spirit. Once we've confessed our sin to God, asked for and received His forgiveness, the Holy Spirit then "fortifies" our soul. He "fills us" (Romans 8:9-11). Talk about having a personal relationship with God-when the Holy Spirit is living within us — THAT is PERSONAL!!!!

DID YOU KNOW?

Not all Africans came to Virginia in chains during the colonial period. Benjamin Lewis, a black servant on a plantation in what is now Prince William County, filed a complaint in the county court on 20 May 1691. Lewis claimed that he was free in England, and had been brought into this country under a contract to serve four years, just as white indentured servants were. His contract, signed in England on 11 June 1686, is among the records of Stafford County. His master, William Harris, claimed the paper was forged. The jury found that the contract was valid and ordered Lewis's release. William Harris appealed the decision, but records of the appeal's outcome are unfortunately lost. William Harris died in 1698 and was buried near Neabsco Creek and Route 1. Later, in the twentieth century, his tombstone was moved to Pohick Church in Fairfax County, where it may be seen today. We don't know what became of Benjamin Lewis.

Dumfries drew international attention to itself in 1963. It was the first municipality in Virginia to elect an African American to public office since the era of Reconstruction after the Civil War. During the time when some parts of Virginia experienced massive resistance to integration, Wilmer Porter, proprietor of a local auto repair business, was elected to the Dumfries Town Council. His wife Mary was one of four black teacher chosen about the same time to begin the pilot desegregation program in Prince William County schools. Wilmer Porter served as a member of the Town Council until 1980. Mary Porter retired after 16 years teaching at Dumfries Elementary School. In 2005, the Porter Traditional School was named in her honor.





The First Mount Zion Seniors' Ministry has existed since the early 2000's under the leadership of the Christian Education Department, and currently serves members and friends, 55 years and older. The Seniors' Ministry currently meets the third Wednesday of the month by Zoom.

The Ministry has grown over the years and now has 188 members and friends on the roll. Seniors engage in many activities at each meeting. Past Seniors' activities included sponsoring the Mary Elizabeth baby shower, played Christian Bingo, engaged in Christmas activities, played Bible Trivia, held their first ever Seniors' Showcase, played Family Feud, had Bible Study with Associate Ministers, created the Silver Steppers, and invited various speakers on many topics, just to name a few.

The Ministry has had many capable leaders in the past and is currently being led by Sis. Shirley Hardy and Sis. Pauline Hunter, who invite you to become a part of this wonderful fellowship.

MOVE MORE, SIT LESS: SOME PHYSICAL ACTIVITY IS BETTER THAN NONE!

According to The US Department of Health and Human Services, adults who sit less and do any amount of moderate physical activity gain some health benefits. Some physical activity is better than none! You should move more and sit less throughout the day. https://health.gov/sites/default/files/2019-09/Physical Activity Guidelines 2nd edition.pdf

Examples of Physical Activity:

- · Walking, with a friend, your dog or while you golf
- Dancing
- · Yard work, such as pushing a lawn mower
- House work, such as pushing a vacuum
- Tennis

The intensity of these activities should match your fitness level.

Challenge: When working at a desk, set an alarm every 2 hours and do 20 hip hinges (takes 2 minutes). Fit walking into your schedule whenever you can and start walking at least 5 minutes a day. After a walk, stretch. Try the standing triangle straddle bend (link above), hold the stretch for 15-30 seconds and repeat on the other side. (Hip Hinging and The Standing Triangle Bend can be found in in the links above). One set of Hip Hinges, one 5-minute walk and 2 sets of stretches takes less than 10 minutes!

Please join FMZ's Deaf Ministry in celebrating Deaf Awareness Month in September. The theme for 2022 is "Inclusion". Statistics from 2021 indicate that the deaf community has a higher level of mental health issues now than before the pandemic due to isolation and lack of inclusion

including the ability to have an interpreter present at medical appointments, job huddles and even to socialize at church.

Our own deaf members have indicated a real feeling of loss because of the inability to attend church in person and participate in ministries such as the Parking Ministry that Russell James enjoys. We are happy to be back in worship.

Deaf people often find that it is more difficult to get a good paying job and receive respect as an adult due to preconceived notions that being deaf limits ability.

Here are a few things to do to "include" those who are deaf at work or in your community:

- Always face the person and avoid covering your mouth and lip area. Large numbers of deaf or hard of hearing people are very good at lip reading to assist them in understanding the entire conversation.
- Fill them in if someone else is contributing to your conversation who they cannot see but you can hear.
- Give them a chance to respond and ask clarifying questions.

Did you know that American Sign Language is not universal? Think about how difficult it is to go to a foreign country with no knowledge of the language and a total inability to make yourself understood. The sign language used here (American Sign Language) is not used in other counties. Each country has their own sign language, and the signs mean different things. World Day of the Deaf is celebrated on the last Sunday of September to bring awareness and inclusion to all those who are deaf, which is about 5% of the world population or about 360 million, with about 600,000 of those in America.



SIGNIFICANT EVENTS IN BLACK HISTORY DURING **SEPTEMBER**

September 1664: The Province of Maryland passes the first law in Colonial America banning interracial marriage.

September 1676: Zipporah Potter Atkins, a pioneering landowner and a free woman of color, becomes the first African-American landowner in Boston, and the first Black woman to own land in Colonial America.

September 1739: In the Stono Rebellion, South Carolina slaves gather at the Stono River to plan an armed march for freedom.

September 1829: David Walker was an American abolitionist, writer, and anti-slavery activist. Though his father was enslaved, his mother was free; therefore, he was free as well. While living in Boston, Massachusetts, with the assistance of the African Grand Lodge (later named Prince Hall Grand Lodge, Jurisdiction of Massachusetts), he published An Appeal to the Colored Citizens of the World, a call for black unity and a fight against slavery. The Appeal brought attention to the abuses and inequities of slavery and the responsibility of individuals to act according to religious and political principles. At the time, some people were aghast and fearful of the reaction that the pamphlet would provoke. Southern citizens were particularly upset with Walker's viewpoints and as a result there were laws banning circulation of "seditious publications" and North Carolina's "legislature enacted the most repressive measures ever passed in North Carolina to control slaves and free blacks".

On September 22, 1862, Lincoln issued the preliminary Emancipation Proclamation, which became final on January 1, 1863. Its third paragraph reads:

That on the first day of January, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, all persons held as slaves within any State or designated part of a State, the people whereof shall then be in rebellion against the United States, shall be then, thenceforward, and forever free: and the Executive Government of the United States, including the military and naval authority thereof, will recognize and maintain the freedom of such persons, and will do no acts to repress such persons, or any of them, in any efforts they may make for their actual freedom.

September 1817: Hiram R. Revels, first African American U.S. Senator, was born in Fayetteville, North Carolina.

September 1866: The U.S. Army regiment of Buffalo Soldiers (African Americans), originally members of the 10th Cavalry Regiment of the United States Army, was formed at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas. The term eventually became synonymous with all of the African-American regiments formed in 1866.

September 1904: George Coleman Poage becomes the first African American athlete to win a medal in the Olympic Games, winning the two bronze medals (200-meter and 400-meter hurdles) at the 1904 games in St. Louis

September 1950: Ralph Bunche receives a Nobel Prize for his mediation efforts in the Middle East and becomes the first person of color to receive the prize.

September 1952: Eleven black students attend the first day of school at Claymont High School, Delaware, becoming the first black students in the 17 segregated states to integrate a white public school. The day occurs without incident or notice by the community. The next day, the Delaware State Attorney General informed Claymont Superintendent Stahl that the black students will have to go home because the case is being appealed. Stahl, the School Board and the faculty refused and the students remained. The two Delaware cases are argued before the Warren U.S. Supreme Court by Redding, Greenberg and Marshall, and are used as an example of how integration can be achieved peacefully. It was a primary influence in the Brown v. Board case. The students become active in sports, music and theater. The first two black students graduated in June 1954 just one month after the Brown v. Board case.

September 1962: A force of federal marshals escort James H. Meredith to the campus of the University of Mississippi. President Kennedy federalized the Mississippi National Guard and urged Mississippians to accept the orders of the court in a radio-TV address.

September 1973: Illinois became the first state to honor Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s birthday as a holiday

September 1975: Joseph W. Hatchett sworn in as first Black Supreme Court Justice in Florida and the first in the South in the twentieth century.

September 1980: Arnaldo Tamayo Méndez is launched into space aboard the Soyuz 38 from Baikonur Cosmodrome and becomes the first Cuban cosmonaut, the first person from a country in the Western Hemisphere other than the United States to travel in outer space. He was also the first Hispanic and first person of African ancestry in space.

September 1990: Jonathan A. Rodgers is named President of CBS's television stations division which made him the highest ranking African American in network television. He later became the President of the Discovery Networks before moving on to his current post as President of TV-One.

September 1992: Mae Carol Jemison becomes the first African-American woman to travel in space when she goes into orbit aboard the Space Shuttle Endeavour.


