You might think you don't have time for an intensive, in-depth study, that simply reading through the Bible isn't worthwhile. That's not true. By asking a few questions of each passage you read, you can gain a lot of knowledge and begin to experience the supernatural life-change the Bible promises to those who live by it. As you read, read confidently, purposely, humbly, prayerfully, diligently, practically and intentionally. After each day's reading, answer the following (this is the **OIL** principle of study):

Observation: What does the Scripture say?

Interpretation: What does Scripture mean?

Application: What is my response to the Scripture?

You'll be amazed at what you glean from God's Word! As you grow in **faith** and knowledge, God's Word will *richly dwell* in you, and you'll never go back to simply checking off the boxes again!

Questions for Personal Reflection:

1. Is this your first time reading through the Bible?
2. What do you hope to gain from this experience?
3. What Character do you most identify with in this week's reading?
4. Which text caught your attention and caused you to spend more time studying this week?
5. What is your memory scripture for this week?
6. What will you do differently (Live it out) because of your readings?
7. In what one area of your life would you most like to see spiritual growth?
8. Recall the gifts and talents God has blessed you with. What are you doing with them and how will you be a better, more committed servant for Kingdom of God. In ministry?
9. What is your "nugget" or "take away for this week?"
