# FITNESS-IN-PLACE

### GLUTEAL AMNESIA?

You've heard of amnesia of the brain, but your butt? Yes, there's such a thing as gluteal amnesia, also known as butt amnesia or dead butt syndrome. It is exactly what it sounds like, your glute muscles forget their purpose (keeping us upright and propelling us forward). The glute muscles become neurologically inhibited and don't activate when they should. If your glutes don't activate or are weak, other parts of the body may take additional stress, which can potentially result in injury or pain. That could include low back pain, hip pain, knee pain, and even foot pain.

The main cause of gluteal amnesia is a sedentary lifestyle, we sit too much! The good news is that you can prevent and overcome this by waking up your glutes.



Activate your glutes with the Glute Bridge Exercise.

Lay down on your back with your knees bent and your feet flat on the ground. Your feet should be hip width apart with your toes pointed straight ahead, and your heels should be right under your knees. Place your arms by your sides. Squeeze your glutes and your abs as you start to lift your hips toward the ceiling. Raise your hips as high as you can without arching your back. The goal is to raise your hips until your body is in a straight line from your knee to your hip and to your shoulder. Squeeze the glutes as tightly as you can in the top position while you hold for three seconds. Slowly lower the hips down to the floor, keeping tension in the glutes and abs as you lower down.

**Challenge:** Click on the link above to learn from the National Academy of Sports Medicine the proper way to perform the glute bridge exercise and start incorporating it into your routine to improve your posture, reduce pain and move better.

### SELF-AWARENESS AND NEGATIVE EMOTIONS

Self-awareness helps manage negative emotions such as extreme anger, jealousy, fear and hatred because if we know what triggers our emotions, we can learn to rec-

ognize and control them rather than be ruled by them. Studies have found that more self-aware individuals experience fewer negative emotional reactions and fewer emotional consequences than those who aren't as aware.

In his book, *The Emotionally Healthy Church*, Peter Scazzero contrasts King Saul's lack of self-awareness (emotional health) with King David's. King Saul was unaware of what was going on inside of him. His "doing" for God did not flow from his "being" with God. We see Saul repeatedly blind to his jealousy, fear, hatred, and anger. Unlike David, Saul was not cultivating his relationship with God. Eventually, Saul's life choices destroy him (see 1 Sam 17-31).

We see David passionately nurturing and developing his relationship with God through the Psalms (journaling to God). We see David in Psalms outraged, suicidal, depressed, overjoyed, dancing. We see King David engaging in the whole gamut of emotions. He is broken and vulnerable before God and others. Who else would commit adultery and murder and put it in a song to be sung in church—Psalm 51. After King David's greatest blunder, he asked God to create in him a pure heart and renew a spirit of integrity (Ps 51:10). However, Saul's self-ignorance did not allow him to recognize his need for change.

These journaling prompts along with prayer and the power of the Holy Spirit can help you reflect upon your behavior and allow God to reveal the heart and mind changes you need: What am I most fearful of? Why? Where do I feel the anxiety in my body? What do I need in this moment? What made me feel scared or anxious today? Where do I find myself most—past, future, present? What makes me angry? What makes me happy? What makes me sad? The goals are to become emotionally and spiritually mature by being aware of what's going on inside of you and nurturing and cultivating your relationship with God.



Juneteenth (short for "June Nineteenth") marks the day when federal troops arrived in Galveston, Texas in 1865 to take control of the state and ensure that all enslaved people be freed. The troops' arrival came a full two and a half years after the signing of the Emancipation Proclamation. Juneteenth honors the end to slavery in the United States and is considered the longest-running African American holiday. On June 17, 2021, it officially became a federal holiday.

### **Juneteenth and Slavery in Texas**

In Texas, slavery had continued as the state experienced no large-scale fighting or significant presence of Union troops. Many enslavers from outside the Lone Star State had moved there, as they viewed it as a safe haven for slavery.

After the war came to a close in the spring of 1865, General Granger's arrival in Galveston that June signaled freedom for Texas's 250,000 enslaved people. Although emancipation didn't happen overnight for everyone—in some cases, enslavers withheld the information until after harvest season—celebrations broke out among newly freed Black people, and Juneteenth was born. That December, slavery in America was formally abolished with the adoption of the 13th Amendment.

The year following 1865, freedmen in Texas organized the first of what became the annual celebration of "Jubilee Day" on June 19. In the ensuing decades, Juneteenth commemorations featured music, barbecues, prayer services and other activities, and as Black people migrated from Texas to other parts of the country the Juneteenth tradition spread.

In 1979, Texas became the first state to make Juneteenth an official holiday; several others followed suit over the years. In June 2021, Congress passed a resolution establishing Juneteenth as a federal holiday; President Biden signed it into law on June 17, 2021.

### JUNETEENTH: A BEACON OF FREEDOM AND THE POWER OF INDIVIDUAL IMPACT

Juneteenth stands as a pivotal moment in American history, commemorating the end of slavery and celebrating the relentless struggle of Black Americans for freedom and equality. This day not only reflects on the progress made but also underscores the ongoing challenges in the fight for civil rights. Originating on June 19, 1865, when Union soldiers brought the news of freedom to Galveston, Texas—two years after President Lincoln's Emancipation Proclamation—Juneteenth now serves as a national symbol of resilience and liberation.

The significance of Juneteenth extends beyond historical

reflection, highlighting the importance of individual action and community advocacy in shaping our society. Members of First Mount Zion Baptist Church exemplify this spirit of active service and transformative impact. A notable example is **Dr. George M. Hampton**, whose dedication and leadership were instrumental in recognizing Juneteenth as an official holiday in Prince William County, Virginia, in 2016. His efforts not only honored the day at a local level but also paved the



way for its eventual acknowledgment as a national holiday in 2021.

Dr. Hampton's advocacy exemplifies how individuals can effect substantial change within their communities and beyond. His work reminds us that each person holds the potential to act as a catalyst for justice and equality. As we celebrate Juneteenth, let us draw inspiration from his legacy and the broader contributions of the First Mount Zion congregation. Their commitment to civic engagement and social justice challenges us to continue the work needed to achieve true equality and to ensure our society values diversity, equity, and inclusion.

As we honor this day, let us also commit to being active participants in our communities, advocating for necessary changes, and continuing the dialogue on civil rights. Juneteenth not only commemorates a critical juncture in our history but also calls us to be change agents in the ongoing journey toward a more inclusive and equitable society. Through education, support for voting rights, and fostering civil discourse, we honor the spirit of Juneteenth and move closer to realizing its promise for all. We are reminded of Colossians 3:23, "and whatsoever ye do, do it heartily, as to the Lord, and not unto men." Brother Hampton and scores of others in our congregation, past and present, represent service to God and the principals of equality, liberty and freedom of the Gospel.

As we celebrate Juneteenth 2024 on June 23rd on our Church grounds, let us remember the liberating work of FMZ since 1867 and be inspired to find our work in glorifying God today.




