Objective: Continuing on the idea of worship as one of the elements of the four-step strategy. The focus this week is on being intimate with God and worship that fosters intimacy, and intimacy that results in us being fully devoted followers. We will explore: **God Desires Communion, Communion Through Meditation**, and **Communion Through Worship.** For the most part, this is more personal than communal, more individual than corporate. Yet we do want to touch on the impact of corporate worship on God's intimacy with the congregation.
