ENTERING THE SANCTUARY: A TIME FOR REVIVAL

In moments when life feels chaotic, when problems loom large and solutions seem just out of reach, our natural inclination is to search for answers, to strategize, to "fix" what feels broken. We exhaust ourselves striving for a path amidst the overwhelming complexities that surround us.

The biblical psalmist Asaph profoundly observed, *"When I tried to understand all this, it troubled me deeply till I entered the sanctuary of God; then I understood..."* (Psalms 73:16-17, NIV). This powerful revelation suggests that perhaps what we truly need is not a meticulously crafted plan of action, but rather a profound encounter with the Divine. Asaph's questions and worries brought him to God for answers and guidance. He felt confusion and heartache until a pivotal shift occurred. It was in the act of entering the sanctuary that his perspective transformed and clarity dawned. His understanding was born out of sacred communion. What he truly yearned for, and ultimately found, was dedicated time in the Lord's presence—time to simply *be* and to revel in the joy of that sacred space.

So, where is your sanctuary? Where is that hallowed ground? Can you touch it with your hands or feel it in your spirit, your place where you experience God's presence? For some, it might be the quiet solitude of a church pew on a Sunday morning, or a quiet prayer closet. Perhaps it is dedicated time set aside for diligent Bible study and meditation. For others, it's found in the majesty of nature, in a moment of quiet reflection, or even in transforming the everyday routines of life into intentional moments of divine awareness. The essence of a "sanctuary" lies not in a place or within a rigid schedule, but it is based upon our willingness to open ourselves up to the loving embrace of our Heavenly Father. Our compassionate God does not confine Himself to specific meeting points. He graciously meets us wherever and whenever we sincerely seek Him.

Time spent within this Sanctuary offers profound benefits. It sharpens our spiritual vision, allowing us to perceive God and ourselves with greater clarity and unclouded by worldly anxieties. Devoting time to be deliberately present with the Lord leads to a renewed mindset where the relentless grip of worry is gently replaced by the profound peace that only He can provide. Engaging in heartfelt worship within this sacred space can rejuvenate weary hearts and cultivate spiritual growth, fostering an inner joy and tranquility no matter what storms may rage around us.

Drawing closer to our Father in sanctuary aligns our hearts with His as we are shaped more fully into His divine image. This consecrated time also serves as a powerful means of protection being nestled under His wings in His Sanctuary. We are nurtured and sustained, much like fledgling birds cared for by our Divine Father. From this shelter, we emerge refreshed and strengthened with a clearer vision of His will for our lives. This newfound perspective might indeed unveil a solution to a long-standing problem, or it might simply re-energize us to persevere in the struggle. Sometimes the path itself, with its lessons and transformations, is as vital as the destination.

Now, as we enter August, let us truly make it a season of Revival! Make it a point to schedule time to attend FMZBC's Revival 2025. Also let's take this time to seek the Lord within our personal sanctuaries – the sacred space where we can pour out our hearts to God Our Father, and allow His peace to wash over our souls. Let August be a month where we intentionally draw closer to Him, for in His presence, there is fullness of joy, peace and understanding, for every step of our journeys.

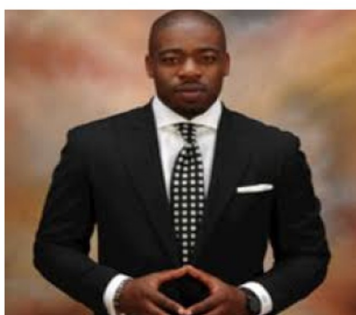

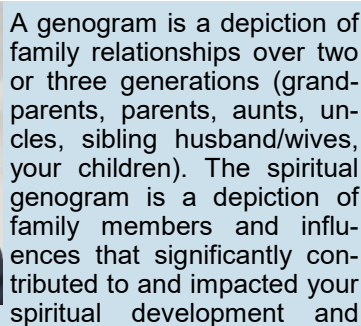

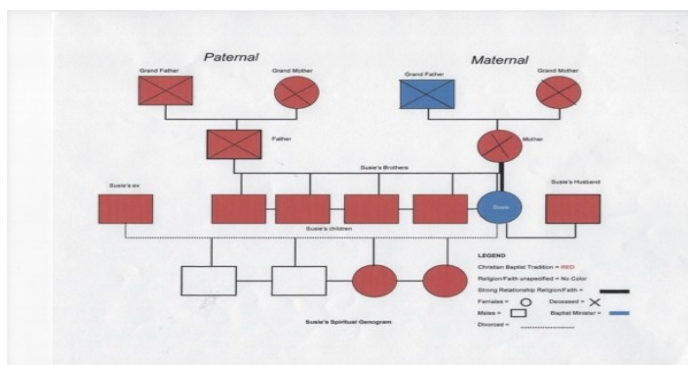

Problem description: The spiritual genogram is the result of the spiritual intake for a 50-year-old female, I'm calling Susie. She spent many years running from her call to ministry. When she finally accepted her call, she was unhappy and depressed. She said she did not enjoy her duties and responsibilities as a preacher in the Baptist Church. Susie revealed that she was a teen bride, divorced due to domestic violence. Susie reported that she and her mother had a strong faith relationship. She knew she was called to preach at an early age. She said men in her family were disrespectful to women preachers (laughed and quoted scripture they interpreted as a put-down for women). She said she "hated" preachers. Susie said her grandfather always told her she could do and be whatever she chose to do and he was the only preacher she loved and respected.

1. To help client recognize her historically rooted religious/spiritual patterns through time: Client recognized that her strong spiritual connection and her call to preach was related to her mother's strong faith and that her mother was very close to client's paternal grandfather who was a Baptist preacher.

2, Explore possible barriers that might hinder service: Client recently moved over 80 miles from her church and she does not like to drive. Client reported when her husband cannot come to church, it is a struggle for her to come alone.



3. Help client explore and understand the change or break in her religious or spiritual tradition: Client is okay with her sons not following the Baptist faith tradition and she believes they know God and accept Jesus even though they do not attend church and talk about their faith.

4. Explore other areas of ministry to resolve possible barriers: Client reported she dreamed of preaching at a church with “all women” when she was 25-years-old.

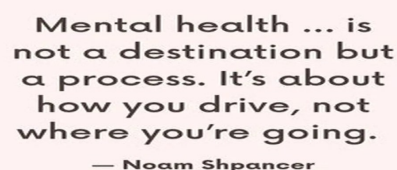
5. The professional counselor comments: Believes that client may not recognize that she may be called to a non-traditional gospel ministry and perhaps she might explore areas of ministry to women. Her motive for moving so far from her church could be that she is not comfortable with being a traditional Baptist preacher; she may have moved further away from her church to justify her limited participation in church.

Susie recognized her call was to minister to women, especially those abused. She recognized God's hand in helping her go through spiritual renewal after the spiritual genogram assessment. Her new goal was to be certified in violence against women so she could minister to, preach to, and teach women.

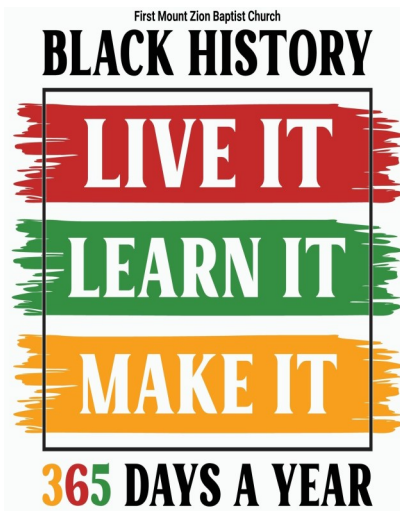
The New Members Orientation Class (NMOC) is comprised of 11 classes of instruction designed to equip new adult members of First Mount Zion Baptist Church with the knowledge, skills, and abilities necessary for effective ministry. The class aims to lay a spiritual foundation that focuses on the walk and work of the whole person in Christ and to ensure that all members understand the FMZBC implementation of God's word. This is particularly important for subjects that often hold controversial methodology in other houses of Zion, such as Baptism and Holy Communion.

Additional graduation requirements include a Spiritual Gifts class led by Reverend Glenda Brown, which is the only class held on a Saturday. This course reviews the various spiritual gifts, the scriptures regarding gifts, and assists you in identifying yours! You will also be connected with ministries where your unique giftedness would be a blessing.

There are two additional classes which can bump up the graduate to the level of Honor Graduate and/or Distinguished Honor Graduate – Overview of Christian Education and Spiritual Warfare. FMZ Archives Committee: May 2007 - February 2013

Major Accomplishments: Approval of Current location for Archives Library/Room; Decided on furniture & placement; made the congregation aware of the Archival effort to retrieve, organize, and display of donated artifacts; regular invitations to all of planned activities, visual displays in the Narthex, chairing the 145th Church Anniversary hosting about 2,000+ worshippers; naming the Archives Room and wording on the entrance; the theme, and others.

In the early spring of 2007, the names of the Archives Committee were selected and each accepted this commitment. These names were brought before the church and were approved as Sisters Carol Burns (later Trustee), Fannie W. Fitzgerald, Glorine W. Gholson, and Joyce S. Thompson. Sister Gholson was named and accepted as the chair of this committee. According to the organizational structure of the church ministries, this committee comes under the authority of the Trustee Ministry. Therefore, Trustee Maxine DuFore served very briefly as the first Advisor from the Trustee Ministry, and later Trustee Andrew Thompson served as the Trustee Archives Advisor through the years. Trustee Thompson attended many of the weekly committee meetings and was a strong advocate during the Trustee meetings on our behalf.

The first official meeting was with Pastor Torian and Trustee DuFore on May 22, 2007. At that time, Pastor Torian explained the Mission as follows:

- ☐ To ensure appropriate proper display of church history
- ☐ To store in a specific location historical documents and artifacts
- ☐ To display different aspects of history of the church throughout the building including the etageres in the Narthex
- ☐ To be responsible for arranging for pictures of major events at the church Pastor Torian suggested that the following order take place by the committee:
 - o Decide on a theme
 - o Survey what documents we have from all sources (Check with Leon Anderson, one of the previous committee chairs to see what he has.)
 - o Start putting everything in order by decades
 - o Decide where and what needs to be displayed around the building
 - o Properly identify (with small plates) the donors, dates, and sources of all pictures, pews, etc. throughout the building
 - o Be prepared to announce to the congregation requests for historical submissions
 - o Retrieve documents which are stored around the building and from the off-site storage
 - o Use Room 313 to begin temporarily storing and organizing documents (This room is to be used only for Archives until such time the committee is ready to move into its permanent room.)

(The committee was praying for a separate, permanent, designated room that would be used for Archives only. This room would consist of historical wall displays, file cabinets with organized pictures and documents, a computer with proper software, related/appropriate decorations, a large table with chairs, and a comfortable seating area where space is available, perhaps a love sofa.)

Later the room on the first floor that was designated for the Credit Union Office was approved for the Archives Library.

The first budget was \$1,500. A detailed budget request was prepared for the new fiscal year.

The committee planned interviews and tapes of some of the older members of the church such as Brother Fred and Sister Agnes Fortune, Sister Katie Johnson*, Trustee Andy Thompson, Deaconess Annie Smith*, Deaconess Bernice Bryant*, Brother Ken Sessoms*, Trustee Murray Parker, Trustee Oscar Dailey, etc. (*Completed)

A survey of at least three churches in our local area as well as the District of Columbia to see what, if anything, they had done to preserve their history. Our findings resulted in none of those surveyed had an Archives Library. Some said that materials were strewn around the church; others reported that certain members had materials in their homes, etc.

A brief bullet list of what this committee accomplished is as follows (not necessarily in the order of happenings): • Organized/tagged/cleaned up (with cleaning rags and cleaning fluids) all the historical documents that were brought from the old churches as well as from the off-site storage unit on Route 1, and donations from the membership. There were boxes and boxes of pictures, trophies, paperwork, displays, etc. • The committee met once a week, usually on Tuesday mornings. • Had identification plates put on all the pews in the Narthex and the one on Level I. • Had uniform frames done for the former three pastors of FMZ. • Cleaned up the etageres in the Narthex and redecorated them. • Presented an oral and written tri-fold request before the Trustee Ministry for a space for artifacts/documents, etc.—an informational trifolds were given to each member. Q/A period was provided by the Trustee chair. All committee members were present at this presentation and felt that positive things would come out of this meeting. • Ongoing announcements/requests for anything from anybody that related to the history of FMZBC were put in the church bulletin on a monthly or bi-monthly basis. As these items were received, they were prepared for presentations, catalogued, organized, and displayed in the FMZ Library.

- Wrote the history and layout for the church Bell plaque that is displayed in the Narthex above the Bell that rang for the old church.
- The current location of the Library on Level I was approved (the designated Credit Union Room). "Oh Happy Day" for all.
- Visited Systems Furniture Gallery in Chantilly for furniture selection about three times. In addition, a representative was the Gallery visited us for verification of sizes, etc.
- Budgeted amount updated to about \$20,000
- Anxiously awaited the arrival/direction of the furniture as we offered a prayer of thanksgiving—another happy day! Bookcases, table, sofa, chairs, open display bookcases, etc. All delivered!!
- The Chronicles of FMZ was recommended and accepted as the name of the Archives Library.
- Committee recommended the biblical scripture which is imprinted on the door: Thus all the work that Solomon made for the house of the LORD was finished and Solomon brought in all the things that David his father had dedicated; and the silver, and the gold, and all the instruments, put he among the treasures of the house of God.--KJV
- The theme: "Preserving our Past and Future as we celebrate our future of FMZ"
- Prepared and hosted the prayerful Dedication of the Library where friends and FMZ members were officially invited to the program and a repast in 'The Grain'.
- Prepared the Litany of Dedication which was led by Pastor Torian before the congregation on the day of the dedication.
- Partnered with the Botts Museum in Dumfries for their FMZ community history day which lasted for three weeks. Certain FMZ documents/historical objects were moved to that location for the entire community to view.
- Hosted a gathering for original members of FMZ since 1947.
- Hosted monthly Open House guided tours on every third Sunday after both services and fifth Sundays after service.
- Chaired the 145th Church Anniversary, April 2012—named a subcommittee made up of church leadership. Met with Pastor Torian every Wednesday after the Monday night meetings to apprise him of our proposed actions.
- Telephone was placed in the Library as requested.
- Email address was assigned to the Library as requested.
- Visited art galleries for suggested art, and one artwork of the Lord's Supper was donated to the church through our initiatives and is hung in the Narthex.

If this committee serves as an example to the new committee, we would just advise that they enjoy this journey of service. We worked hard to accomplish all the above, but we took time to go out to have lunch meetings both on-site and off-site. We took lunch (including Carol's homemade cakes) to the homes of the elders for our interviews and just enjoyed the conversations of their versions of historical events.

We could not pass on this service to the church without thanking those who were so instrumental in accomplishing our goals. To Trustee Maxine DuFore—we say thanks for getting us started. To Trustee Andrew Thompson—we say that we owe you a great debt of gratitude for all that you have done to move us to this point. Your historical knowledge of the church and your support made most of this possible.

And last, but not least, we thank Pastor Torian for his direction, guidance, and support through the years. Whatever we asked, you were always there to meet with us and to listen to our requests—whether the answer was yes or no.

So, this committee passed the torch of dedication to Sister Gwen Hopson as Archives Chair and her committee. May God continue to bless all your efforts in this regard!

PRIDE DESTROYS, HUMILITY BUILDS

"Be humble and give more honor to others than to yourselves." Philippians 2:3 (NCV)

The Bible draws a clear distinction between pride and humility. While pride will tear down your relationships, humility builds them up and strengthens them.

But pride is self-deceiving. It can be hard for you to recognize it in yourself. Instead, try looking for the symptoms of pride, like criticism, competition, stubbornness, and superficiality. If you see some of those characteristics in yourself, you might have a problem with pride.

Proverbs 16:18 says, *"Pride leads to destruction; a proud attitude brings ruin"* (NCV). I like how the Message paraphrases this verse: *"First pride, then the crash—the bigger the ego, the harder the fall."*

Pride destroys relationships, but humility is the antidote to pride. Humility builds relationships. The Bible says in 1 Peter 3:8, *"Live in harmony, be sympathetic, love each other, have compassion, and be humble"* (GW). And Philippians 2:3 instructs, *"Be humble and give more honor to others than to yourselves"* (NCV).

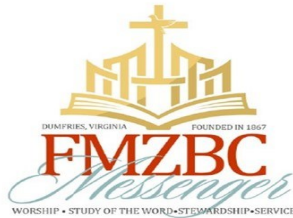
How can you grow in humility? By continually and consistently submitting your thoughts, heart, attitude, and choices to Jesus. You need to give him permission to make changes in your life. Ephesians 4:23-24 says, *"Let the Spirit change your way of thinking and make you into a new person"* (CEV).

How do you become a new person? How do you start to think in a different way? The basic law of relationships is this: You tend to become like the people you spend time with. If you spend time with grumpy people, you get grumpier. If you spend time with happy people, you get happier. So if you want to have more humility, spend time with Jesus Christ. Take time with him in prayer and reading his Word. He is humble, and as you get to know him, you'll become more like him.

The Bible teaches, *"You must have the same attitude that Christ Jesus had. Though he was God, he did not think of equality with God as something to cling to. . . . When he appeared in human form, he humbled himself in obedience to God"* (Philippians 2:5-8 NLT).

No one has lived with more humility than Jesus. He came to earth from heaven to become a man, live for us, give his life for us, and be resurrected for us. When you spend time with him, you become more humble, which in turn builds up your relationships for the better.
